Maunakea! Depending on availability, you'll see the
control room, mirror coating chamber, and of course the
telescope itself.

- ★ Free public visits every other Thursday at 10:30 a.m.
- → Visitors will require a

 4WD vehicle to visit.
- ★ Max. 10 visitors per tour; reservations are needed in advance.
- → The Gemini North telescope is located at an altitude of 4200 meters (13,825 feet); altitude sickness is common at this level and all visitors should be in good health.
- → Visitors will need to bring water, lunch, and/or snacks.
- → Visitors must be at least 13 years old; minors aged 13 to 17 must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- → Visitors should expect a tour of approximately 4 hours duration from their arrival at the Maunakea Visitor Information Station (VIS) at 10:30 a.m. to their return to the VIS.
